Prayer service for the season of creation

This year's logo for the season of creation is – "Abraham's Tent" symbolizing a home for all. It is a call to practice care of creation as an act of radical hospitality, safeguarding a place for all creatures in our common home, the household (oikos) of God. We pitched "Abraham's Tent" in the garden space as a sign of hospitality for all beings who are excluded. Among these people are humans, the planet people, the four legged, flying and swimming people, rock people, star people and more, were brought into the Tent to pray with us.

The prayer session started with an introduction about the significance of Abraham's Tent and God's call to each human being to keep our garden that honour the dignity of each creature and conserve their place in the abundance of life on earth. A hymn was sung in which all creatures praise and thank God the creator of all things. The word of God from Genesis Ch. 1 reminded us that God created all things on earth and heaven and found that everything was good. The congregation thanked God for the earth, the creator and the strength of all creatures. The Holy Spirit, who renews the world, calls us to care for this creation. Psalm 84 was recited to re ~ affirm that the earth is the Lord's and all that is in it. We in unison sang a hymn that praises God as creator.

St. Francis of Assisi reminds us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us. This sister now cries out because of the harm we have inflicted on her by our irresponsible use and abuse of the goods with which God has endowed the universe. We concluded the prayer service by asking God's blessings to enlighten us by his spirit that renews the face of the earth and safeguards ''a home for all".



A creation walk: (Ecological Rosary)

We organised an ecological Rosary on 27th of September 2021. The sisters went in a procession, holding the statue of our lady, singing hymns and reciting the rosary during in the campus. The varieties of fruitbearing trees, huge green shady trees are an attraction to many. The multi- coloured flowers, bushes, varieties of birds and butterflies and the cool breeze greeted us as we walked along singing the praises of God, our creator. Malai Matha shrine, a popular pilgrim centre, 18 KM away from Mathur, was chosen as the ecological site for meditation. The shrine is built on the top of a huge rock surrounded by vast forest area crowned with rows of mountains. It had deep fissures displaying man's greediness and selfishness. It stood tall and sturdy withstanding the lashings of rain, hail and storm, thunder and lightning for hundreds of years. In the calm, serene atmosphere we sat and meditated for some time. This meditation helped us to realise the ever abiding presence of God in us and His constant and unconditional love for us.
