

Fight Against Covid 19

In the light of COVID – 19, declared pandemic by WHO led to the immediate lockdown in country. Delhi, a capital of India shares the substantial population of economic migrants in it. Preventive mechanism in the form of complete lockdown has created a concern of bread butter on daily wage labours. Stranded labour migrant population struggled with the suspension of train and bus services, these restrictions have left them with no source of income and insufficient ration in their families. Institute of Sisters of Charity, 21 A Ring Road, Lajpatnagar - IV, New Delhi - 110024 distributed 100 ration kits to such poor families and individuals in Mustafabad and Mayurvihar in North East Delhi with the support of community volunteers, and stakeholders.

The main target groups were:

- Migrants, slum, daily wagers and vulnerable families
- Stranded individuals

The kit contains the following supplies.

- 1. 15kg Rice
- 2. 2 Ltr Oil
- 3. 2kg Dal
- 4. 1kg Sugar
- 5. 1kg Salt

Many young people came forward as volunteers for the packing and distribution of kits. They were given appropriate protection gears. Information about each individual beneficiary were also recorded for documentation and reporting purposes.
